lain McIlwee, CEO of the British Woodworking Federation (BWF), said: "Rather than seeking a magic bullet, it is a broad strategy that covers all parts of the housing sector, ensuring that the volume housebuilders are free and encouraged to build on available land."

Just how successful this new initiative will prove to be is yet to be seen, but the effort and intentions are being wholly welcomed by the timber industry. The BWF say that they are ready to support local authorities in ensuring that the natural advantages of wood are put to good use in delivering desperately needed sustainable housing.
